Housekeeping

<u>Literacy</u>

Students have finished up their persuasive letters last week and I will be checking them to see how they did. The goal was to take all things learned from the year in mini-lessons on word choice, organization, conventions (spelling, grammar, punctuation) and sentence structure, and create a piece independently, without conferencing with me to show that they are able to begin and end a piece using the strategies taught over the school year. I took a quick peek as they handed them in and am excited to read them more thoroughly.

We will be taking a closer look at fairy tales and poetry for the remainder of the school year. We will look at story structure (plot, characters, conflict, theme and setting) as a way of breaking down a story into its elements. This is a way for students to see the importance of organizing their own writing.

<u>Math</u>

Last week the kids took a look at Measurement. They learned how to find the area of regular and irregular shapes (length x width). We look at benchmarks of centimeter and meters (fingernail, doorway) so that students can estimate. Finally on Friday students went outside and were given dimensions in meters and asked to create large shapes and find the area. This was a fun and beneficial activity for kids as they learned some real-life skills. This week we will continue looking at measurement using different shapes.

<u>Bulletin</u>

A reminder that the weather is getting warmer. Please be sure to send a water bottle with your kids each day. They are running around on the playground and are very thirsty throughout the day. If they have a water bottle on their desk it prevents them from making multiple trips to the fountain, missing out on learning.
